




How to Make Al Sound More Human

Al writing is useful, but it can sound robotic. Small tweaks can make it more natural and engaging. Here are four simple ways to add a human touch.



IDEA 01

ADJUST THE TONE

- Use conversational language.
- Keep it professional yet approachable.
- Add humor or warmth when appropriate.

Robotic: "During my visit to Europe, I explored various historical landmarks and sampled local cuisine."

More Human: "Wandering through the streets of Rome, I stumbled upon a tiny café with the best espresso I've ever had."

IDEA 02

BREAK UP LONG SENTENCES

- Shorten long sentences for better clarity.
- Use contractions to make text sound more natural.
- Read the text out loud to check the flow.

Robotic: "My European adventure included visits to Paris, Rome, and Barcelona, where I engaged in sightseeing, cultural experiences, and enjoyed local delicacies." **More Human:** "I spent my days exploring Paris, Rome, and Barcelona. Each city had its own magic. Breathtaking sights, rich culture, and incredible food."

IDEA 03

ADD PERSONAL STORIES OR EXAMPLES

- Include real-life examples or experiences.
- Use specific details to bring the content to life.
- Ask questions to invite engagement.

Robotic: "I visited the Eiffel Tower and found the view to be quite stunning." **More Human:** "Standing at the top of the Eiffel Tower, I watched the city light up as the sun set. It was the kind of moment that makes you pause and take it all in."

IDEA 04

EDIT FOR NATURAL FLOW

- Remove unnecessary words or awkward phrasing.
- Adjust sentence structure for a more conversational feel.
- Ensure the message feels natural, not forced.

Robotic: "A key highlight of my trip was visiting the Colosseum, where I learned about ancient Roman gladiators and their historical significance." **More Human:** "Walking through the Colosseum, I could almost hear the echoes of the past. It was surreal to stand where gladiators once fought."
